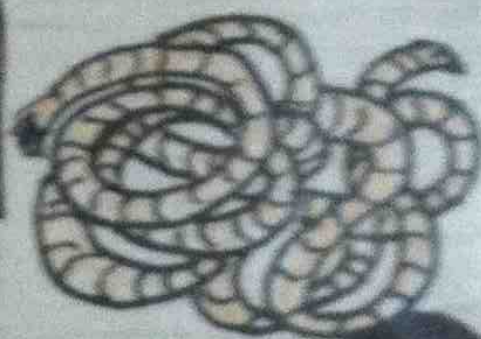
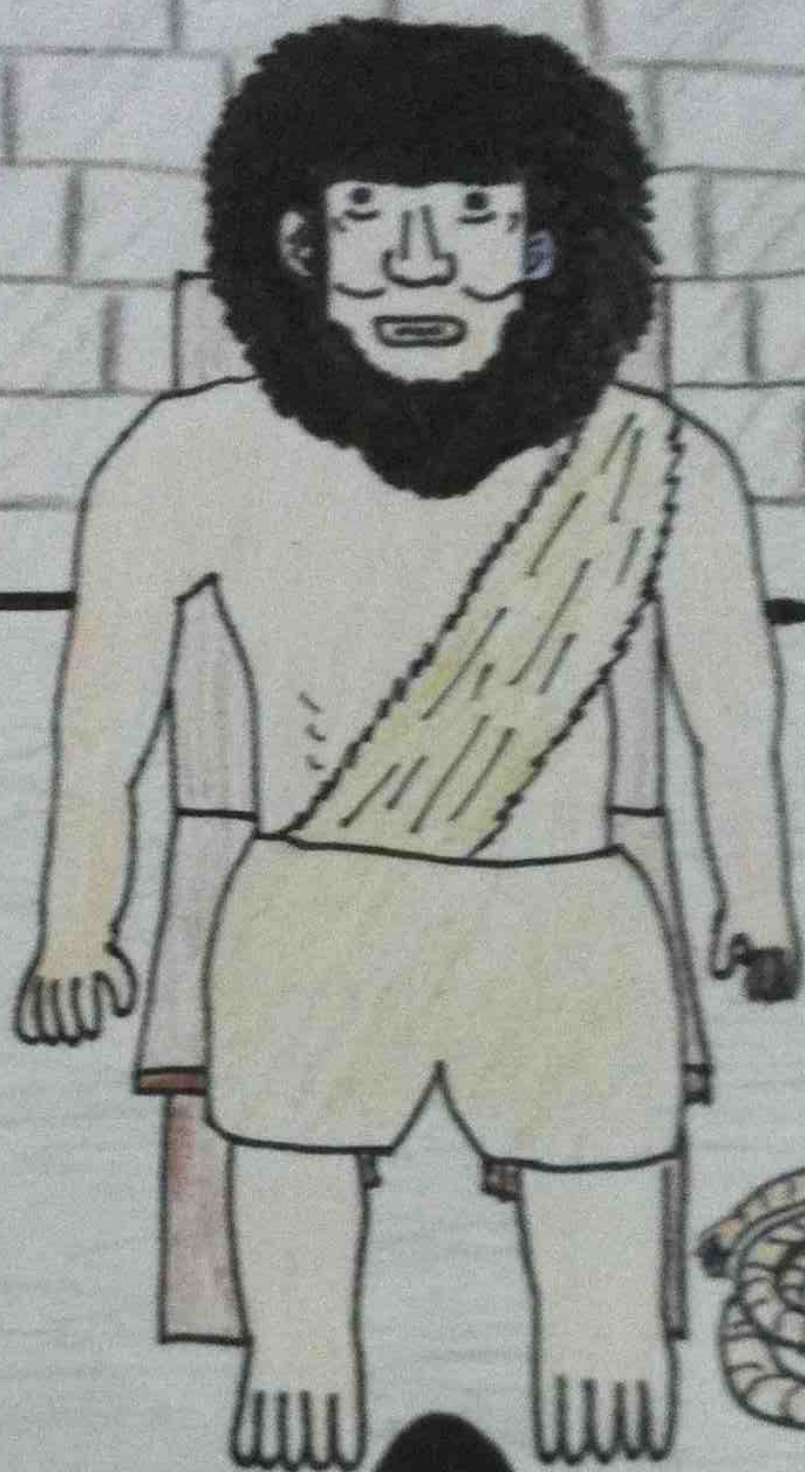

“I now lay upon my back, and at a full length, on a species of low framework of wood.”(Pg 236)



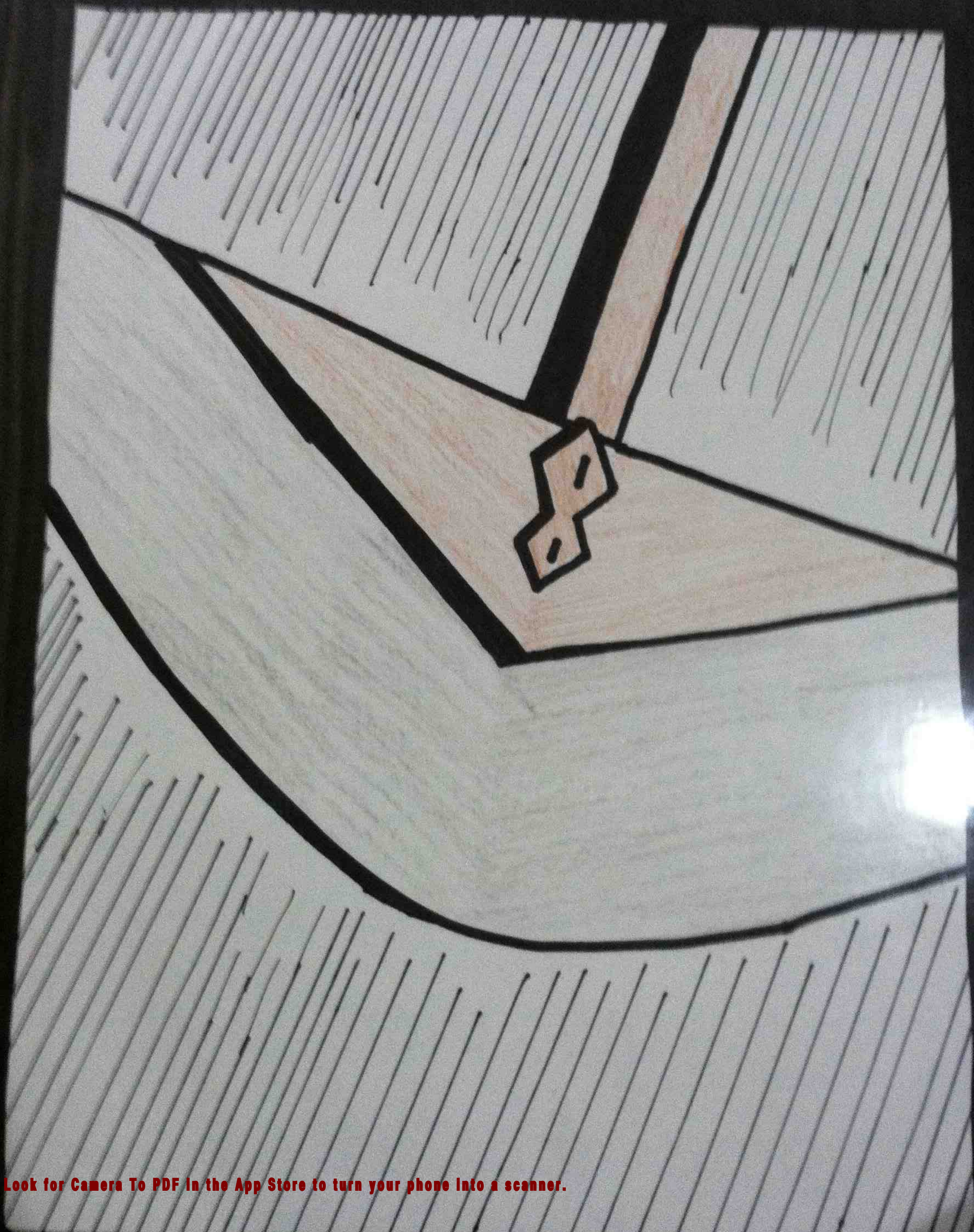

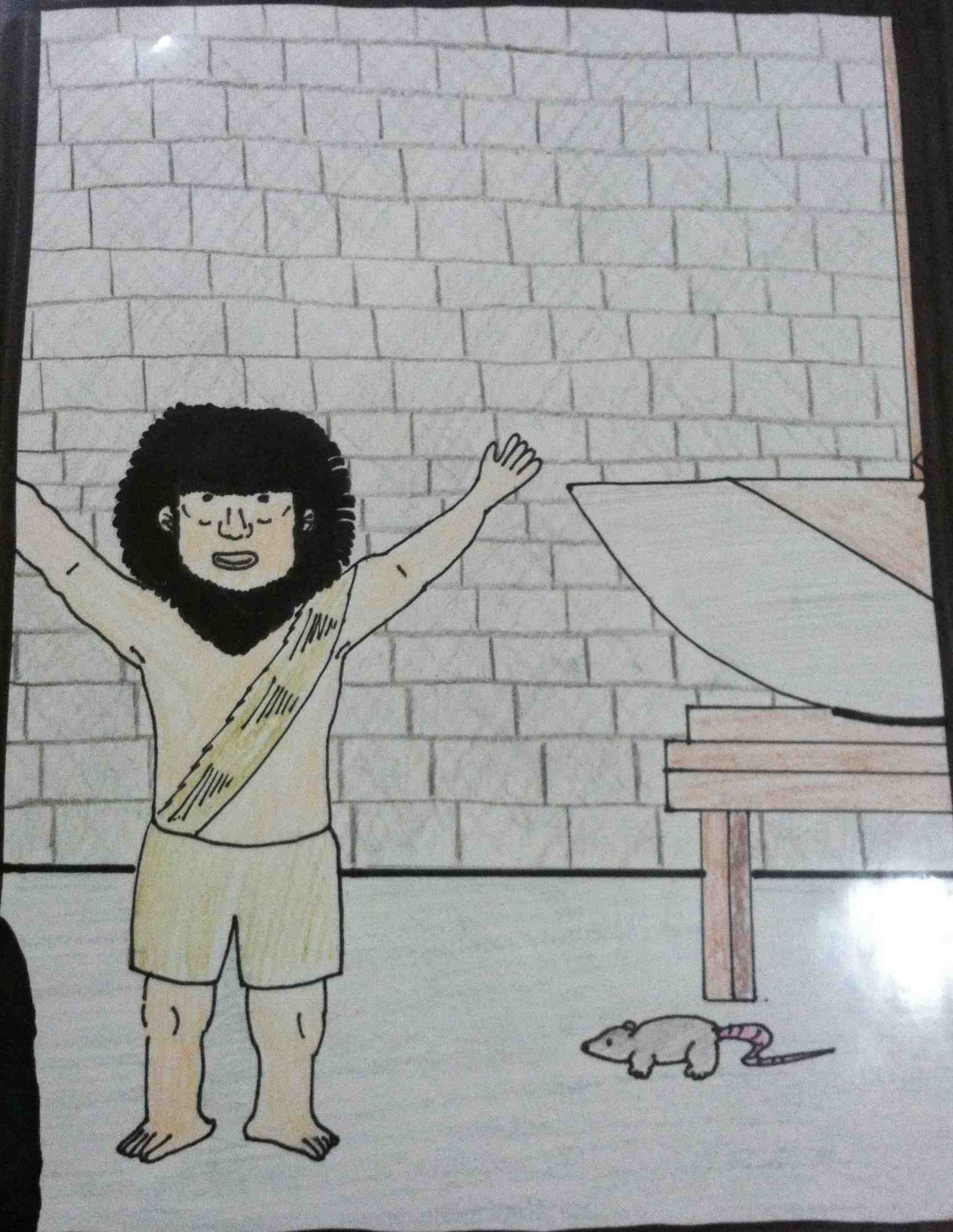
